**Open Syllable**

- 1 vowel alone or preceded by a consonant
- Long vowel sound
- Coded with a macron —

$\bar{V}$ 
 $C\bar{V}$ 
 $CC\bar{V}$   
 $CCC\bar{V}$

**Silent e Syllables**

- Vowel – consonant – e
- E controls the sound of the first vowel
- First vowel is long
- E is silent

$\bar{V}C\grave{e}$ 
 $C\bar{V}C\grave{e}$

**Consonant – l e Syllable**

- At the end of a polysyllabic word
- Last syllable ends in – l e
- Never accented
- E is not sounded
- Count back 3; look for a consonant – le
- Divide with a [

 $\overset{3}{c}\overset{2}{a}\overset{1}{b}|l\grave{e}$

- a r    e r    i r    u r    o r
- Vowel followed by 1 r     $Vr$

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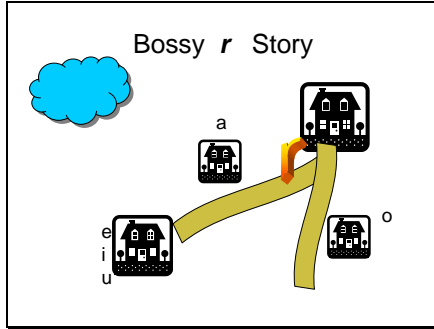

**Vowel Team Syllables**

- 2 vowels paired together giving 1 sound
- Regular Vowel Teams - ai first vowel long second vowel silent

Irregular Vowel Teams - short vowel sound or first vowel silent and second vowel long

Vowel Digraphs or diphthongs - oi, oy
